

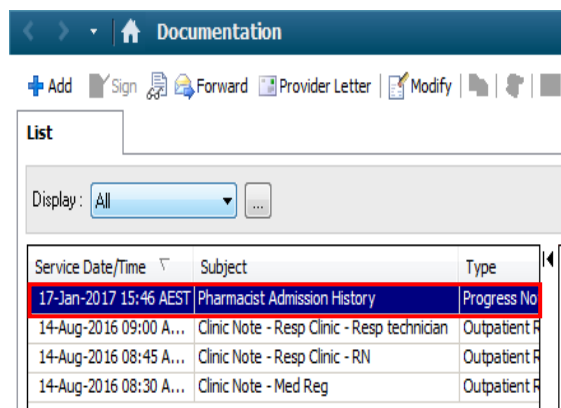
## Admission Medication Reconciliation (Pharmacist)

### Quick reference guide

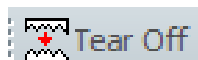
1. From the *menu* bar select the *Documentation* tab.



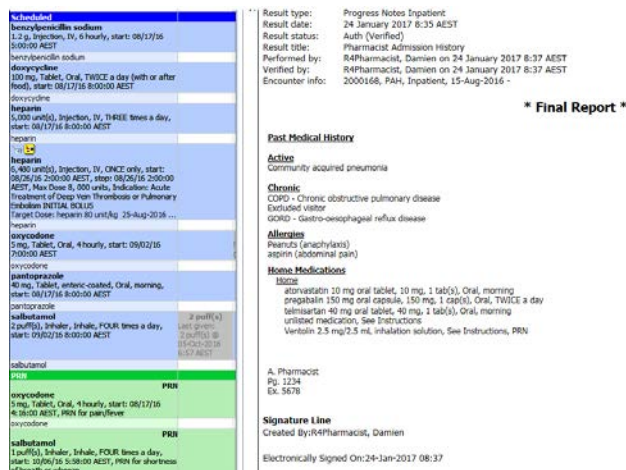
2. Select the *Pharmacist Admission History* note from the list of notes




3. Now use the *Tear Off* function from the top toolbar to open this *Pharmacist Admission Note* in a separate window



4. From the *menu bar*, navigate to the *MAR* and now compare the *Pharmacist Admission Note* to the current inpatient medication orders

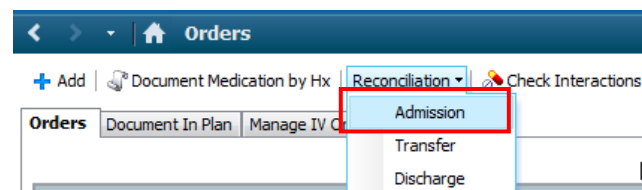




 Note: Pharmacists can also use the Admission Reconciliation window as a quick view to see what the prescriber intended on admission.

5. From the *menu* bar click on the *Orders* tab.



6. Next click on the *Reconciliation* located at the top of the orders page. A drop down box will appear. Now select *Admission*.



7. Documented home medications are identified by the scroll symbol  and inpatient medication orders are identified by the hospital symbol

8. Medications are continued by the medical officer (**not the pharmacist**) by selecting the green




radio button . If medications are to be discontinued on admission, the medical officer




will select the red radio button . Continued home medications will have a medication with a



scroll symbol  on the left hand side of the page and a corresponding order with a hospital



symbol  on the right hand side of the page. Medications not continued on admission to hospital will not have a corresponding order on the right hand side of the page.
